REGISTRATION INFORMATION

CCM offers camps for school-age children Kindergarten and up. Some camps are only available to children of a specific age group, as per instructor requirements. Please refer to the descriptions attached to the program schedule before filling out this registration form.

Camp registration is on a first-come first-serve basis. A deposit of half the camp fee must be paid at time of enrollment, and the remainder is due on or before the first day of camp. Cancellations will be refunded, minus a \$20 handling fee per camp, if requested at least 3 weeks prior to the camp start date. There will be no refunds or credits for cancellations made less than 3 weeks prior to the first day of camp.

One week summer camps are \$175/week, Monday through Friday, 12-5pm, unless otherwise noted. Fees are calculated at \$7.00/hour. Partial scholarships available. All children must have a current Identification & Emergency Information form and signed Admission Agreement on file to attend camp.
